Each property owner will be permitted to take the equivalent of TWO pick-up truck loads of "junk" to the Borough Park to be collected and placed into the dumpsters by BOROUGH EMPLOYEES.

If you are a landlord, *you are responsible* to see that your renters are cared for.

***NO ONE WILL BE PERMITTED TO DUMP WITHOUT PROVIDING PROOF OF RESIDENCY.
